Project Amazonas



One of our goals for 2009 is to assist senior year law students in Brazil by helping citizens with their legal problems as well as ours.



After two years in the planning stage 7 to 17 makes its debut. We need more advertisers.

Project Amazonas is a project about saving the People, the Rain Forest and the Pink Dolphins of the Amazon region in South America. Our primary area of focus is in Brazil since it is the largest land mass to deal with. Some parts on the Colombian side of the Amazon we dare not venture as they still have a lot of drug activity going on in that region, the same is true in Peru. We have more people that are familiar with Brazil and therefore we will concentrate more in and around Tabat-

inga, Brazil than the rest of the Amazon. From Tabatinga we will then train the residents about forestry, specifically rain forest conservation, soil conservation and water conservation. Water is a vital part of the rain forest and its conservation. This will be a great opportunity for many Universities and other conservation groups to participate with us.

There are three parts to this project. **Part one** is the people of the Amazon region. (See Map) 1.056 million square miles or 1.7 million square kilome-

ters.. They have little to look forward to and less government help. We will have more about this on the web site.

Part two is the Amazon Rain Forest itself and the conservation of it. Which also includes the Amazon River.

Part three is to Save the Pink Dolphins. Yes, Ethel there really are Pink Dolphins.

8 Million Children On The Streets In Brazil

An estimated 8-10 million children make their living on the streets in Brazil, primarily because of extreme poverty. For most of these children, whose families cannot afford to feed them, life on the streets may be their best lifestyle alternative. A child working on the streets may earn several times the wages brought home by a parent working as a domestic or laborer. The average wage

poor Brazilian workers get is barely enough to feed and clothe one or two people.

On a still darker side of this situation, according to most conservative estimates, four children are killed every day in Brazil. During the first 90 days of Fernando Henrique Cardoso's administration, a President who ran on a platform in which children problems had priority, more than 270 kids were murdered in Rio de Janeiro alone.

All of this happens despite recent important victories for

the children's movement in Brazil. The decade of the 1980s has put the law on the side of the children. Although implementation of the Child and Adolescent Statute, an exemplary legislation approved by Congress, is problematic, the foundation for acceptance by the Brazilian people is in place because of the public relations successes of the movement. Today those numbers could be much higher. AmerinRio along other NGO's are doing what we can for them.

The Dolphin Hotel Project

The Dolphin Hotel Project is part of Project Amazonas to help the people of the Amazon region to gain control of their Rain Forest and provide income for themselves and the town of Tabatinga. With the mayor of Tabatinga donating the land we will construct a hotel to accommodate tourists, dignitaries and scientists for research. The Hotel will be self sustaining and will provide training for as many people as we possibly train over three 4 month cycles. They will be trained in

every aspect of the hospitality industry. Along with our regular staff we will have the use of these trainees to help with the operation of the hotel. Once the facilities have been completed we will then offer special group pricing and tour packages. The hotel will also house state of the art video conferencing, meeting rooms, dining facilities, as well as a pool, Jacuzzi, sauna and complete gym. Although this hotel will be located in the middle of the rain forest we anticipate building a world class golf

course here to hold championship tournaments. At this stage we need all of our readers and supporters to participate in this venture. We will need designers, architects, builders, and of course lots of money.

The Dolphin Hotel will be the only one of it's kind within a 700 mile radius. The nearest hotel of this stature would be in Manaus which is 700 miles away by plane.

Our training facilities will house classrooms that will be used by the hotel and by guests that will be invited to teach subjects such as soil conservation, reforestation and conservation, water conservation for the Amazon River and local

water supplies. The hotel will be used as a focal point for scientists, tourist, government officials to study and gather information about the effects of the Amazon on the environment.

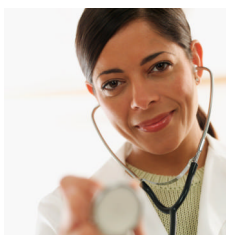

Architect finishes plans for AmerinRio Cultural Center

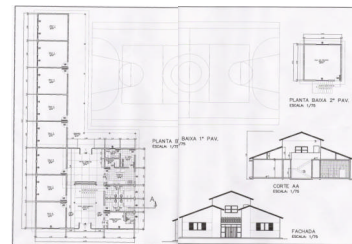
In December of last year our architect finished the designs for our Cultural Center and office spaces. The land for the first cultural center is to be donated by the mayor in Rio de Janeiro.
